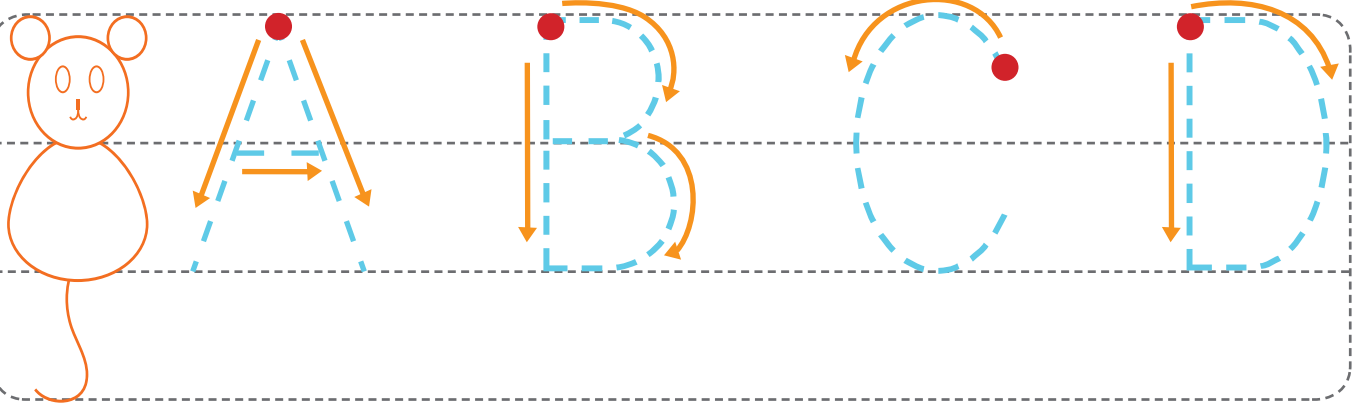
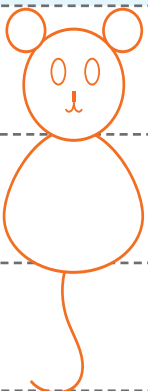
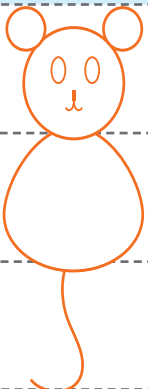
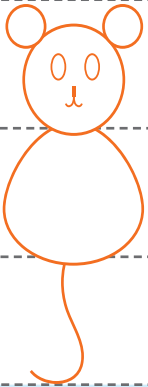
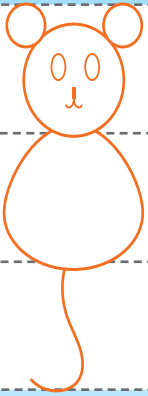


Hooray for handwriting!
