



Describe capacity with Lerato

Capacity is the word that we use to describe how much of something a container can hold.

For example: When compared, a glass has less capacity than a bucket. A bucket has more capacity than a glass. This means that a glass can hold less water than a bucket and that a bucket can hold more water than a glass.

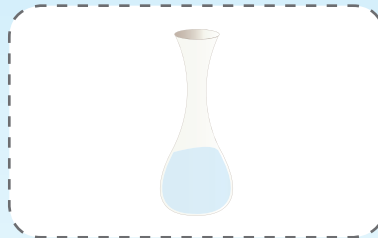
