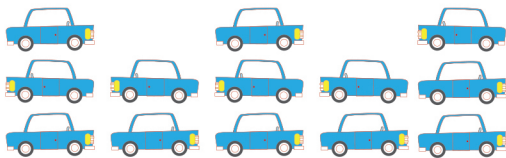


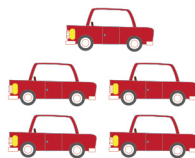
Problem solving

- 2 In a fruit basket there are 3 apples, 5 bananas and 2 pears. How many fruits are there altogether?

- 3 Lerato and her cousin each have 6 dolls. How many dolls do they have altogether?



- 4 You have 17 comic books. You give 5 comic books to a friend. How many do you have left?



Teach the learners the following method to answer word problems:

- What does the problem tell us?
- What does the problem want to know?
- What are the key words?
- What operation must be performed?

Remember to introduce number sentences, for example $2 + 4 = \square$

Always encourage learners to explain or/and show their working out.

- 5 There are 20 pencils in a box. I give 7 to my brother. How many do I have left?

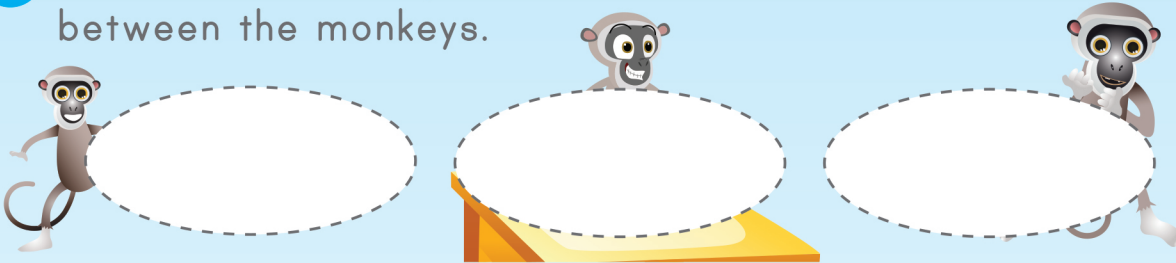

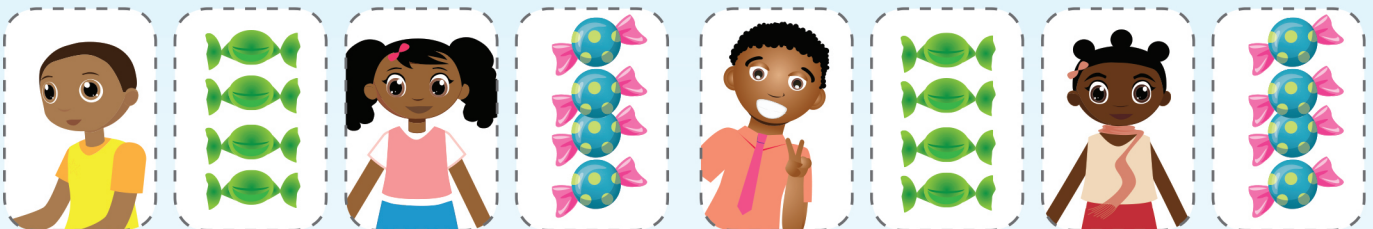
- 6 There are 20 marbles in a bag. Share them between Lerato and Thandi.
