

Question and exclamation marks

Lerato listens to Gogo and learns lots of things. If she does not know something, she asks a **question**.

To ask a question, a question mark (?) is used. A question mark looks like an ear because it always asks for an answer (you need to listen carefully for what questions are asking).



What school do you go to?



When Gogo needs to emphasise what she is saying, she speaks more loudly. This is called an **exclamation**.

To write an exclamation, an exclamation mark (!) is used.



Do not run in the road!
