

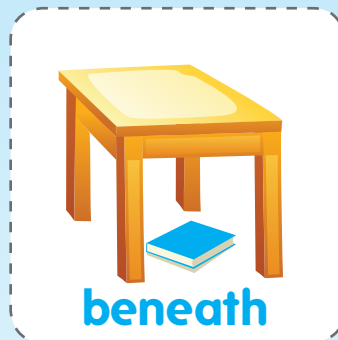
Prepositions

Prepositions are **togetherness** words. Prepositions bring together an object in a sentence to the words that tell us about it.

Look at these sentences. The **prepositions** answer where and when about the 'book'. In these sentences 'book' is the object. The prepositions are in **bold**.



The book is **on** the table.



The book is **beneath** the table.



The book is leaning **against** the table.



The book is **beside** the table.



She held the book **over** the table.



She read the book **during** class.

Prepositions of time tell us when something happened and prepositions of place tell us where something happened.
