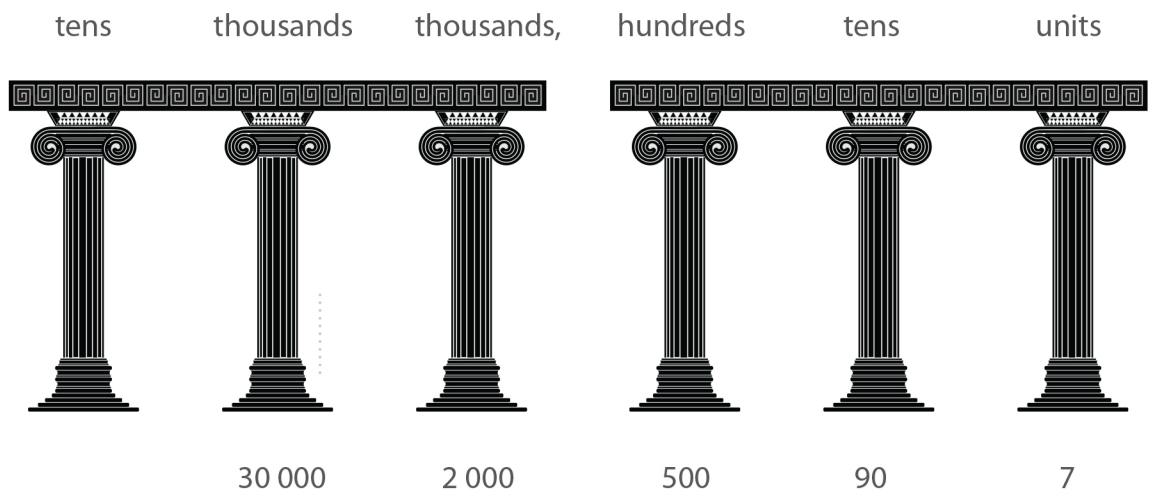
Whole numbers: adding and subtracting in columns

Note

Each number has a numeric value depending where it is placed. A comma is usually placed after the million and again after the thousand.

For example: **6, 840, 211**
