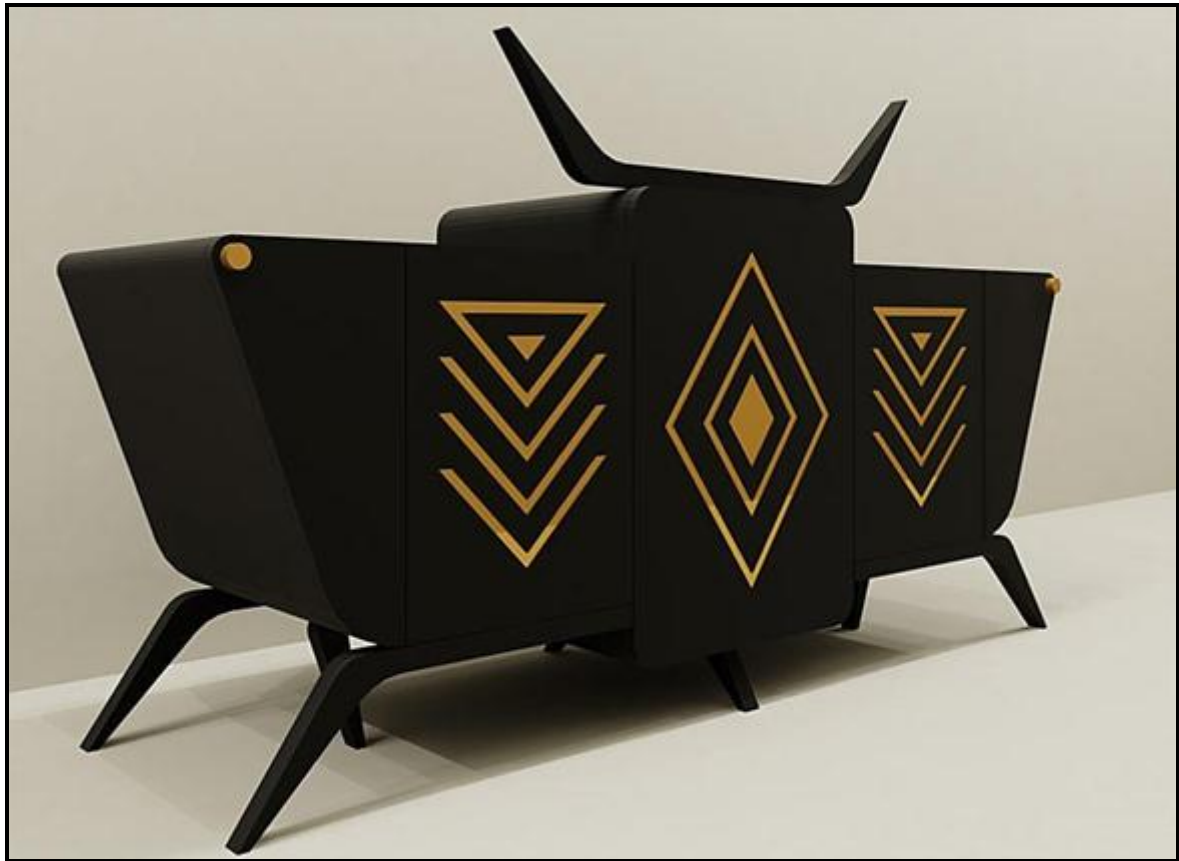


FIGURE B: **Banami Ancestry Server** (sideboard) by Sifiso Shange (South Africa), 2020.

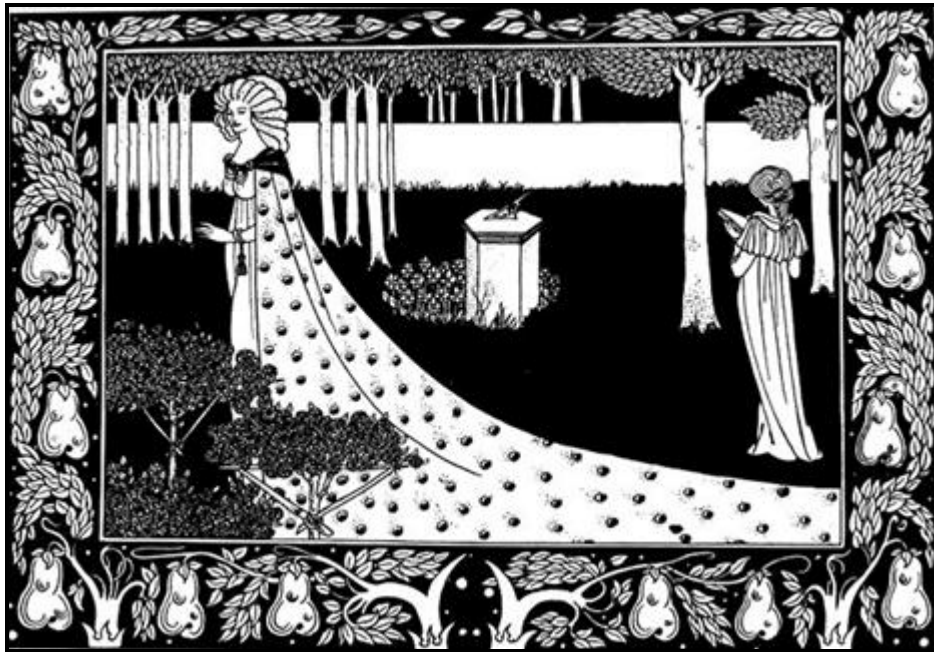

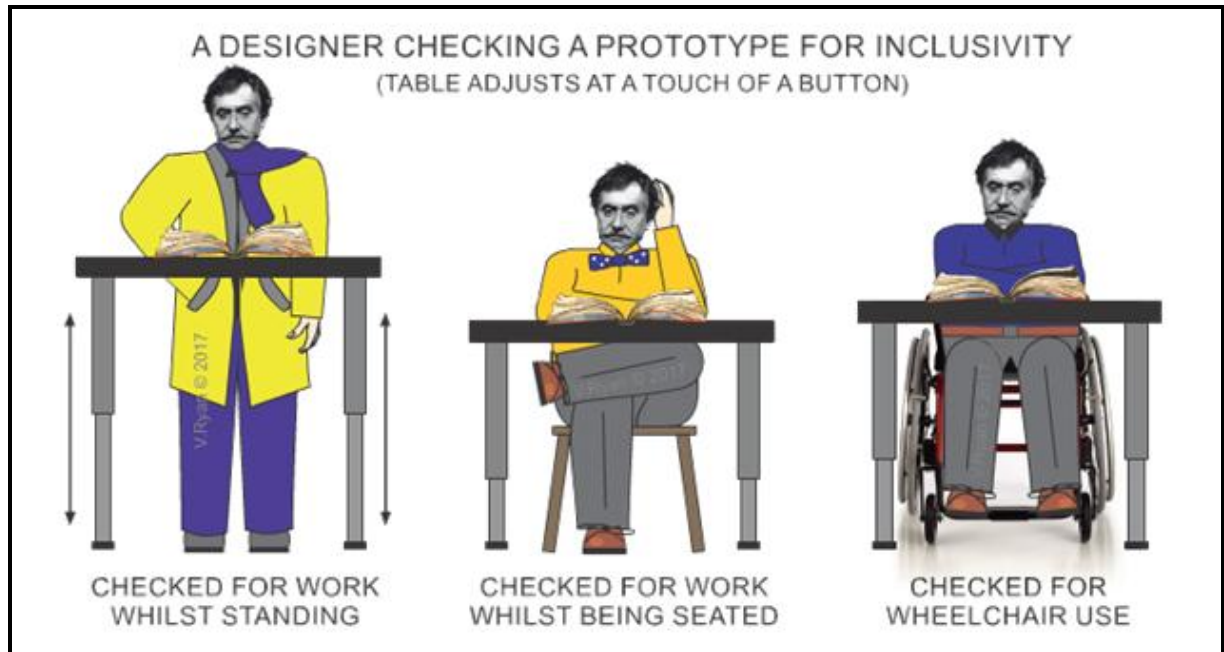
