**XENOPHOBIA AND RACISM**

This week, members of Operation Dudula<sup>1</sup> were reported to have stopped black migrants from accessing health services at Kalafong Hospital in Tshwane. The self-appointed gatekeepers decided whether to accost<sup>2</sup> patients, check their papers and possibly turn them back, or let them go unhindered.

Apparently the only criterion was skin colour. Unsurprisingly, white people got a free pass. Black people were split into two groups of a darker and lighter skin tone. The spectacle of black people using blackness as an instrument of discrimination against fellow blacks is rich with irony.
